Each year, Better Together Animal Alliance (BTAA) is faced with new challenges, surprises, and heartwarming stories and 2022 was no different. With your support we have been able to help more animals receive important medical care, find homes, and help more families stay together. Thank you for your continued support and generosity.

Together we helped families through hardships such as housing challenges, illness, and at times, loss. The latter is the case for Linda and her dog, Daisy. In October Linda adopted Daisy from our animal care center through our Senior to Senior program. Daisy was an 11 year old small breed dog. It was love at first sight for both of them. Just over a month later, Linda called our Helpline. Daisy had become very ill and after being rushed to a local veterinarian, Daisy drew her last breath and passed away. It was sudden and Linda was devastated. Being a senior on a limited income made Linda unable to cover the cost of the vet bill and she reached out for assistance. Thankfully, our Helpline was able to help her pay the vet bill and although Linda was brokenhearted over the loss of Daisy, she knew in her heart she had given Daisy the best gift. Daisy's last days were filled with love and companionship.

In December Linda came to BTAA, ready to adopt again. She fell in love with a small breed dog named Heidi. It was so sweet to see. We waived the adoption fee, and they went home together. Linda said she loves being able to give senior dogs a loving home to live out their time, whether it be days, months, or years. It's her goal to give them a happy life.

This is just one of the hundreds of stories that have touched us this year. The human-animal bond transcends age and socioeconomic status. Because of supporters like you, we can help loving people like Linda enjoy all that comes with it.

## Every Gift Makes a Difference

At the start of 2022, BTAA received a generous pledge from a local couple to match up to \$5,000 for medical care for sick and injured cats and dogs. BTAA's dedicated supporters were up to the challenge and met the goal. Little did we know, the generous start to the new year couldn't have come at a better time.

In February, the sweetest 12-week-old puppy found her way to our animal care center in need of help. She had been hit by a stock trailer, suffered a broken humerus, broken rib, and had a large hematoma on her tiny stomach. Our skilled veterinary team performed surgery on the hematoma, X-RAY'd her leg and rib and made a plan to help her recover. She was placed into foster care and monitored by our veterinary team until she was ready to be adopted. The happy ending? She was adopted by long-time supporters of BTAA and received the most fitting name of Lindor, like the chocolate. Today - over one year later - she's thriving!

People from all around our region helped make Lindor's story possible by donating to our medical program. She's just one example of the lifesaving services BTAA provides to thousands of cats and dogs each year.

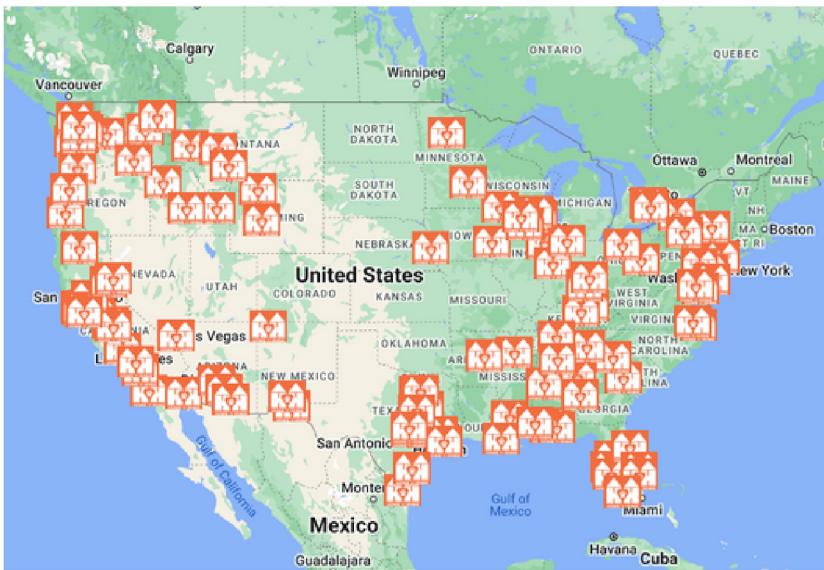

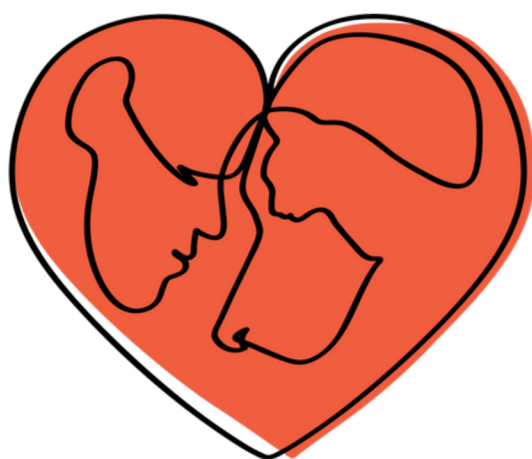
