## Letter from the Director

With every year that passes, my appreciation of the human-animal bond deepens, and so does my gratitude for the staff, volunteers, donors, and community members who make our work possible.

Better Together Animal Alliance is the largest animal welfare organization in our region, and we play a critical role in keeping people and pets together and helping animals with nowhere else to turn.

In 2024, our work focused on increasing access to veterinary care for our region's animals.

We increased access to affordable public spay and neuter services for community-owned pets. We reduced unwanted litters of cats by providing Trap-Neuter-Return services for community cats. We offered free weekly microchip clinics to ensure lost pets can be swiftly reunited with their people. We participated in community events to provide free vaccinations and wellness exams to pets in need. We took in sick and injured stray animals, provided lifesaving emergency veterinary care, and found them loving homes. We helped pets go from one home to another without ever entering our animal care center. And, just like we always will, we took in stray and owner-surrendered animals and helped them find loving new homes, ensuring each and every one of them was spayed or neutered, vaccinated, and microchipped.

While I'm so proud of the difference we made this year, our work is never done. People and animals still need us to support them in their time of need. As we look to the future, we're dedicated to helping our region's most vulnerable animals. Those who are lost, sick, injured, or have nowhere else to go will always be able to rely on BTAA to care for them.

Without the support of a skilled team, passionate and dedicated volunteers, donors, and community partners, our impact simply wouldn't be possible.

With gratitude for the progress we have made and optimism for the future,



#### **Every Gift Makes a Difference**

When Ladybug arrived at Better Together Animal Alliance, her life was on the line. She was found by a good samaritan as a stray with open wounds and a severely broken front leg. Our veterinary team jumped into action to assess what was wrong and to make her as comfortable as possible. We performed an exam and took X-rays, and the results were grim.

Her front leg was broken in several places. She had a gunshot wound to her shoulder and she had a large laceration on her side. Despite the severity of her injuries, Ladybug lay looking at our team with complete trust, almost as if she knew she'd landed among people who would take care of her. Unfortunately, the severity of her leg injury required amoutation. While she was in surgery, we carefully closed her wounds and cleaned her up. She recovered with the help of staff, volunteers, and medication to help her stay comfortable.



Ladybug struck the eye of a loving adopter who would give her the love, patience, and support she needed to recover from her injuries and the trauma she endured before she was brought to BTAA. Now, Ladybug is affectionately named Bugs, and she's living out her days alongside her human companion.

Generous supporters made Bugs' lifesaving story possible, along with so many others who came to BTAA sick, injured, or in need of help in 2024.
